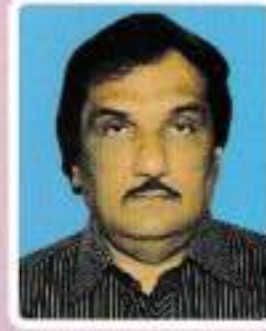

RULES OF ATTENDANCE AND DISCIPLINE

1. No Student shall absent himself / herself from the college without prior permission. Application for leave must be made in advance to the Principal in the form provided for the purpose, through the concerned tutor.
2. If a student absents himself / herself for a week without submitting leave letter his / her name will be removed from the rolls unless he / she can prove that his / her omission to obtain leave was unavoidable.
3. If a student, absents himself / herself in any part of the morning or afternoon session, he / she will be considered absent for half a day.
4. Students are not permitted to leave the college during college hours without the prior permission of the Principal. Letters relating to irregular attendance of the student will be sent to the parents or guardian. The parents should meet the Principal for remedial action.
5. A student entering the class after the roll-call should report his presence to his / her Associate / Assistant professor otherwise the student will be marked absent.
6. 75% Attendance is compulsory to appear for the University examinations.
7. The progress report gives an evaluation of performance of the student in the CIA and model examination. The periodical progress reports and attendance reports of student will be reviewed by the Principal and the concerned tutor. Students who do not show progress and whose performance is unsatisfactory will not be permitted to appear for the university examination.

8. Except in very special cases, students will not be allowed to absent themselves from CIA and examinations. Monthly tests will be conducted regularly and mark sheets will be sent to the parent or guardian of each student.
9. Every student on the college roll is assigned to the care of a tutor, one of the members of the staff whom he / she can consult on all matters on which he / she requires advice and guidance.
10. Students are expected to conform to the dress regulations laid down by the college.
11. Students are permitted to represent the college in inter - collegiate competitions only with the prior permission of the Principal.

DRESS AND BEHAVIOUR

1. Every student shall wear clean, decent and respectable dress, modest enough for the academic institution.
2. Boys are not permitted to wear T-shirts and Jeans Pants to college. Girls are permitted to wear half saree or chudidhar with long thuppatta.
3. Every student shall greet the professors within college premises.
4. No student shall leave the class room without the permission or until the professor has left the class room.
5. Students are required to maintain silence in the classrooms. Students should avoid using the corridors except when moving from one class to another.
6. All students should wear their identity card when they are in the college campus.

7. Students should greet the Chairman, Trustees, Principal and members of the Staff when they meet them and be polite and courteous.
8. "Ragging" of any kind is not permitted either inside the college campus or in the hostel or outside. The students who are guilty of the offence will be dismissed from the college and also handed over to the Police authorities for further action as per the Govt. orders.

LIBRARY RULES

1. All students of the college are members of the college library.
2. Every student using the library will be given two "Borrower Cards", bearing his / her roll number, name, course and section. Each student is permitted to borrow two books at a time from the library.
3. Students will be entitled to keep a book for one week from the date of issue. The book must be returned to the library, on the due date marked on the date slip. But it may be reissued to the same person if there is no demand for that book. When reissued, the book may be retained for a further period of one week. The book should be produced at the library for every renewal. Each student is permitted only two renewals for a book, if not required by any other student during the period.
4. A student failing to return a book on the due date will be fined one rupee for each day after the due date until he/she returns it to the library.
5. The library is open on all the working days of the college.
6. Every student who wishes to take a book from the library shall fill in the application form and present it at the issue - counter of the library.

7. Books will be issued to students in exchange for a library card during the working hours of the library as specified by the librarian.
8. While returning a book, the borrower must take back his / her card. Otherwise he / she will be held responsible for the book taken on that card from the library.
9. Final year students must surrender their cards at the end of the academic year.

ISSUE OF CERTIFICATE

To get the course certificate, the students should submit an application stating the reason for the need of the course certificate, signed by him / her, countersigned by the Parent / Guardian and Tutor / HOD. Only then the certificate will be issued by the college authorities. This procedure has to be followed for getting course certificates, attendance certificate and all other certificates.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

Every student admitted in our college is under the care of a teacher who acts as his / her tutor. He guides the students (wards) assigned to him / her in all his / her educational welfare and other matters. All the leave applications and other application for issue of certificates such as course certificate, attendance certificate, identity certificate and monthly progress reports etc., of the ward are to be countersigned by the tutor / HOD. No application without tutor's counter signature will be entertained at the college office.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

National Service Scheme sponsored by Thiruvalluvar University is one of the extra curricular activities conducted by our college. Two units of NSS (Unit - I Boys and Unit II Girls) are functioning. All students of our college are eligible to become the member of NSS

Service to public is the primary aim of NSS The students of NSS are trained in aspects such as social service, leadership, environmental cleanliness and campaigning, first aid, AIDS control and adult education. This enable him / her to face all sorts of Eco-Social challenges. Regular NSS camps are organised every year to train the students to gain self - confidence.

CITIZEN CONSUMER CLUB (CCC)

Citizen Consumer Club aims at creating awareness among the students on their rights, duties, responsibilities and strengths as a consumers.

Various Lecturers / Seminars / Competitions are being conducted at our college to educate the students on the following aspects.

- * Importance and applicability of Consumer Protection Act
- * The way to approach the consumer forum.
- * To understand the various rights available to them and realise the need for collective action to fight for their rights.
- * Importance of spreading consumer education.
- * To enable the students to be aware of the unfair trade practices, adulterations, misleading advertisements etc..

RED RIBBON CLUB (RRC)

The club aims to create awareness about HIV / AIDS among the students and pass on the message to the general public.

It also aims to develop leadership qualities in the students and transform them into integrated educators who can analyse the social change in the society.

The slogan of the club is, "EACH ONE REACH TEN"

ROTARACT CLUB

Rotaract means Rotary in action. The students in the age group of 17 to 24 can become members of rotaract club.

In our college the rotaract club was started on 28th August 2009. The Rotaracts actively participate in blood donation, pulse polio and road accident awareness camps.
